Please practice the popcorn words daily. Take a few and put cards around the room and have your child find and read them. Make sentences using the cards. Fluency will increase with more exposure to the reading process. Please make a point of reading the textbook each night to build confidence. The Rainbow Fish and Belugas worked with spelling and sight words from our stories. Many of you have done Raz-Kids on a daily basis but there are still some who have not completed at least 15 minutes each night. This is part of their homework when I do not send home the journals. The more reading your child experiences the more comprehension and fluency they will have. In Science we read a book and saw a video on the season of spring as we explore weather.
