It was a fabulous week of learning. We started the week with exploring nature at Morton Wildlife. The students were very excited about feeding the birds and observing various plant life. The students are really getting into a routine and developing strong study skills. It is important to practice word cards, math facts, math numbers and fluency every night as this increases confidence as a learner. The Kindergartners worked with the letter Aa as an initial and medial sound in words and pictures. I am encouraging them to sound out simple CVC words as they learn new sounds. In math we worked with ordering numbers 0-5. The First Graders read a great story about a storm which was integrated into our science study about weather and weather patterns. In math we worked with one digit addition and composing and decomposing numbers 0-10. It is essential to practice spelling words and number facts each night. Please make fluency a part of your nightly routine. In Social Studies we talked about what it means to be responsible in school, at home and in the community.
