I hope everyone had a happy and healthy New year! The children appeared well rested and up for all the new challenges and milestones that lay ahead of them. We hit the ground running with learning new sight words and spelling words. I will be sending home a list of new sight words each week for the Kindergarteners. You can cut them into flashcards to review daily. It is so important to practice these words as part of your homework each night. On a monthly basis I will be sending a cumulative list for review. The First Graders have received a list of sight words that they also should review each night to increase fluency. In math the Kindergarteners are working on addition using manipulative. The First Graders have worked with the concept of ten more or ten less. I will start sending home a minute math sheet in their homework packets. Please do this activity 3 times weekly for a minute at a time. This will help to build their math fluency facts. Please sign the sheet each night to confirm its completion in only 1 minute. The goal is to be able to complete the sheet by June in (1) minute sittings. It is essential to practice to build fluency which will benefit them as they grow and mature. In Social Studies we worked with cardinal directions and map skills. The children will begin to map out our classroom and then our school using these concepts. Have a wonderful weekend!
