It has been a great week of learning. The Kindergarteners have been working with reading and writing CVC words. Please encourage them to sound out words on their own. It is important to review sight words and read each night. One group read a story about a friend's neighborhood. We will discuss places that are in our neighborhood and write about them. They will use their experiences at the pizza place, library, YMCA, etc. to tell us about each. The First Graders read a story about friends racing together and staying on task. They realized how if we do not focus we can lose a race and so much more. We worked on characterization by identifying the characters and their qualities. They will create their own character to put in our class book. In Science we began a unit on "What's in Our Sky?" We will be travel to the moon and explore the stars, including our brightest star, the sun. In math the Kindergarteners are working with simple addition and subtraction and the First Graders are working with related fact families. Please read each night with and to your child.
